As our children learn about the virtue of Faith this month of September, the saints' lives can encourage us all as we grow in Faith. Here are four treasures of advice from saints whose feast days we celebrate as kids go back to school.

"Unless you believe, you will not understand."

St. Augustine received a Christian education, but a great moral and intellectual crisis stifled his faith in his teens and early adulthood while he sank to the despairs of a pagan lifestyle. He was a great rhetorician and academic; and it was his love of reading, along with the kindness of a bishop, prayers of his mother, and Divine inspiration, that led him to devote himself to the pursuit of true philosophy inseparable from Christianity. **His feast day is August 28, the day of his death.**

"To love God as He ought to be loved, we must be detached from all temporal love."

Just as St. Augustine realized that seeking knowledge without seeking God will never satisfy the soul, so too **St. Peter Claver** advises that seeking love without seeking God is in vain. Known for his superhuman charity, during his life he baptized and instructed in the Faith more than 300,000 slaves brought from Africa to Spain. **St. Peter Claver's feast day is September 9.**

"There are, moreover, three virtues which perfect the devout person with regard to control of his own senses. These are: modesty, continence and chastity."

St. Padre Pio who bore the wounds of Christ and suffered in secret, showed deep piety even as a very young child solemnly consecrating himself to Jesus at age five. Children desire to learn how to be virtuous. It is said that St. Pio lived sick but died healthy. **That day is his feast day, September 23.**

"Let us love God; but at the price of our hands and sweat of our face."

St. Vincent de Paul's zeal for souls knew no limit; to him all occasions were opportunities to exercise it. He tirelessly worked for the poor and established the Daughters of Charity. It is estimated that he wrote 30,000 letters in his lifetime to inspire patronage for his missions. His hard work is commemorated on **his feast day, September 27.**

As children, teens, and even adults return to school this fall, let the lives of the saints remind us to learn and love first for the glory of God, and then for the kindness and charity we can show to one another as we work hard and dedicate ourselves to further the Kingdom of God.
