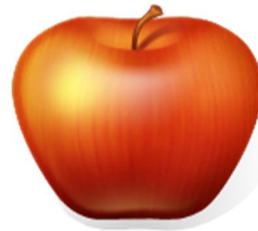

We are also busy writing Poems in second grade. We wrote two kinds and learned how easy it is to write a poem. They don't even have to rhyme.

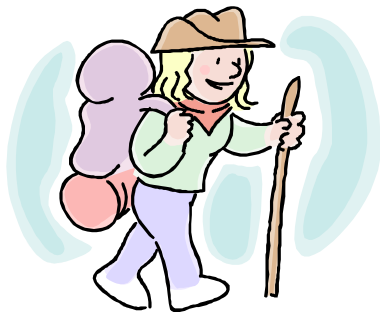
